PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

September 2023

Dear Parents/Guardians:

I would like to thank all of our parents and guardians for choosing Metacomet Elementary School for your child's school. We will provide your child with a challenging learning environment that encourages high expectations for success through development-appropriate instruction that allows for individual differences and learning styles. Our school promotes a safe, orderly, caring, and supportive environment. Each student's self-esteem is fostered by positive relationships with students and staff. We strive to have our parents, teachers, and community members actively involved in our students' learning.

Please take some time reviewing this handbook. We respect all parents and guardians as our student's first teachers. We must work together to help your child grow into a lifelong learner and a good human being. You are a welcome member of our school. This begins at our front desk where our friendly and helpful administrative assistants will help to answer any of your questions/concerns. I will also help you in any way possible. You can find me at the front door greeting students and parents in the morning. You will also see me saying "goodbye" to students and families at the end of the day. We want you to feel comfortable sending your children to Metacomet School. If you have any concerns or feel that your questions have not been answered, please see/call me.

Please be aware that all visitors/parents must have an appointment with a teacher to be able to walk through our halls. We take the safety of our students very seriously. Everyone that is allowed to pick up students MUST have their name on the student emergency cards that are kept in the nurse's office. Please make sure that you call the school and speak to our school administrative assistants and update your phone numbers/emergency cards each month. If there is ever an urgent situation, we must be able to reach you.

While your child/children are at Metacomet Elementary School, we expect them to grow into lifelong-learners. We have a rigorous curriculum that is based on the Common Core State Standards.

Our academic day begins at 8:45 am. The teachers begin the day with "morning meetings" from the "Responsive Classroom" where students are greeted by one another, they share something about themselves, and we review the school rules. After we discuss the schedule for the day, and if time permits, the class will play a group game to get everyone adjusted to school and working with others.

Students have 120 minutes of literacy (Open Court) per day which includes a 30 minute phonics/word analysis lesson; a 60 minute reading and responding lesson and a 30 minute language arts/writing lesson. Students also have a 75 minute math block (Bridges/Number Corners) each day which includes a 60 minute math lesson and a 15 minute number corner lesson.

The students go to lunch for 30 minutes and have recess for 30 minutes. During lunch we encourage our students to eat healthy. This includes having a well-balanced meal with vegetables, fruit, and a mix of protein and complex carbohydrates. At recess, students will play and have fun with their classmates in an unstructured break. We have a wonderful playground. Our students LOVE it!!

Finally, the students will have a 45 minute Unified Arts class each day (physical education, music, art or library). They will also receive an additional 30 minutes of Unified Arts once a week. During physical education, students must wear sneakers to participate. When our students have library, they can check out books to read at home. These books must be returned the following week.

During the course of each day we will teach and model our school rules: Respect, Responsibility, and Self-Control. We want our students to do well both academically and socially. We also want our students to love coming to school. We will be holding many fun and exciting events at our school like: Community Forums, Family Literacy Night, and Family Math Night

I hope you and your child/children have a great school year here at Metacomet Elementary School!!!

Promoting Parent Involvement

The following are suggestions for you, the parent, to be involved with your child in his/her education.

- Control the quantity and quality of television programs your child watches (Suggestion maximum 1-2 hours of television per day (Disney Channel, PBS, Discovery Kids...)
- Please have your child avoid watching violent shows and playing violent video games (MA ratings)
- Engage in frequent conversations with your child
- Listen to what your child has to say
- Express interest in what your child is doing in school
- Check to make sure your child has completed the homework
- Speak positively regarding school, teachers, and education
- Develop a good relationship with your child's teacher, the principal and other school staff that work with your child
- Spend time with your child- take your child on educational trips (Museums, libraries, fairs...)
- Make sure your child eats well balanced, nutritious meals {Protein, Complex Carbohydrates, fresh fruit and vegetables}
- Make sure your child gets plenty of rest {8-12 hours a sleep per night}
- Make sure that your child has regular health checks (physicals, hearing, and vision tests)
- Make sure that your child attends school regularly and arrives to school on time (School starts at 8:25 am)
- Play games and read books with your child
- Be patient with your child

General Information

1. School Hours and Extended Day

- a. Metacomet elementary school hours are 8:25 am to 3:25 pm
- b. please make sure your children are in school by 9:00 am or they will be marked late (exception- if the bus is late)
- c. on early release days, school will be dismissed at 1:25 pm
- d. extended day will be canceled on early release days
- e. the boys and girls club/extended day program will be open till 5:00 pm

2. Attendance Procedures:

In an effort to monitor the safety of our students, we will use a call back system as follows:

- a. On the day(s) your child is absent, you are required to call the school at 860-286-2660 before 9:00 am to notify us of the absence
- b. If you do not call us, we will have an automated call to your home to verify the absence
- c. When your child returns to school, please send a note explaining the reason for the absence

3. Arriving to School

- a. Children are not allowed on school grounds until 8:25 am. There will be no supervision before that time. If you need before or after school care, please call the Bloomfield Board of Education Extension Program at 860-769-4225
- b. WARNING: please drop students off between 8:25 to 8:45 am
 - we do not have staff on duty to watch your child before 8:25 am
 - instruction starts at 8:45 am and we want all of our students to get the instruction they need
- c. WARNING: please walk your child to our front door from the parking lot
 - we want all students to arrive to our school safe

4. Departing From School

- a. If you are picking up your child at 3:25 pm, please drive by the cafeteria door and stay in your car. The children will be in the cafeteria. You must present a picture identification card at all times when picking up students and your name must be on the emergency cards that are filled out by parents/guardians at the beginning of the school year.
- b. The following procedures are in effect for the students who get picked up:
 - Parents/Guardians will drive to cafeteria doors and pick up their child. We will not allow our students to walk home alone!
 - Please have your picture identification card out and ready to show daily. {We will NOT allow students under the age of 18 to pick up your child unless we have a note from the parent/legal guardian}
 - Any person picking up a child from our school must have their name on that child's emergency card (parents are required to fill out the cards and call us with any changes)
- c. WARNING: please pick up students by 3:25 pm
 - Metacomet staff work until 3:30 pm
 - Students are in rooms learning until 3:15 pm
 - o No staff are on duty after 3:30 pm

5. Student Early Pick Up

- a. PLEASE USE THE STUDENT AGENDA or write a note to your child's teacher if you plan to pick your child up early
- b. If your child is to be dismissed before 3:25 pm, you must send a note specifying the time and reason for the early dismissal
- c. Medical appointments should be scheduled after school- if possible
- d. If someone other than a parent will be picking up your child, you must indicate this on the note. This person's name must be on the Emergency Card in the nurse's office
- e. You must call the office by 2:00 pm if you plan to pick up your child. {Please do not come at the end of the day-3:15 pm- to try to pick up your child. The students are in the hallways getting ready to board buses and this creates much confusion}

6. Riding Non Assigned Buses

a. We will NOT allow students to ride a different bus than the one scheduled for him/her

7. Bus Procedures For Students

- a. The bus rules are found on page 25 in BUS section. Please read and discuss these rules with your child. We will review them during the first week of school and during our morning meetings
- b. A child who violates bus regulations will be reported to the principal by the bus driver
- c. The principal will speak with the student and call the parent
- d. There MUST be an adult at the bus stop monitoring your child in the mornings and afternoons. If no adult is present, the bus driver will bring your child back to Metacomet School
- e. The principal may withhold bus riding privileges for serious and/or repeated infractions

8. Emergency Cards

- a. Each new school year, it is your responsibility to complete an Emergency Card for each of your children. The school secretary and nurse must have the names on file, the address, and telephone numbers of the people who can be contacted in case of an emergency. The school should be notified monthly of any changes in the emergency information
- b. Please update your phone numbers and emails for all our all-call systems
- c. Please include all individuals over the age of 18 that you would like to pick up your child from school

9. Inclement Weather

- During the course of the school year, it may become necessary to cancel school, delay the opening,
 or dismiss the students early. The radio and television stations make frequent announcements
 regarding school closings, delays, and early dismissals
- b. In the event of an early dismissal, we will call the parents using our "All Call" system. We must have all updated numbers on the emergency cards.
- c. The Bloomfield Board of Education office calls all major daycare centers
- d. Please DO NOT call the school to ask about early closings
- e. The early dismissal time will be at 1:25 pm. Our Extended Day program will be canceled on all early dismissal days

10. Health Services (School Nurse)

- a. If your child is sick (fever, vomiting, diarrhea, COVID-19, serious injury...), please keep him/her at home. If a child gets injured at school, we are responsible for immediate first aid only. The school nurse or designated person will administer the first aid.
- b. It is the parent's responsibility to bring in any medication to school. *Under no circumstances should medication be given to children to bring to school. We consider this dangerous to the children and we may call DCF!!*
- c. It is important to note that if the appropriate medical forms are not completed and returned to school, your child will be withheld from any extracurricular activity, including field trips and after school activities
- d. A full-time Registered Nurse is on duty in the health office at Metacomet Elementary School. Any medical conditions that the school needs to be aware of should immediately be brought to her attention. Her telephone number at school is 860 286-2660.
- e. Students are referred to the nurse as the need arises. Students should not be sent to school if the parent is the least concerned that an illness is not over or that a relapse might occur during school. It is better to keep the child home until the parent is sure that the child is well. Parents are also encouraged to handle any health problems that occur at home. Cuts, scrapes, bruises, poison ivy, sprains, etc. should be addressed at home. Due to the increase in the number of medically impaired students at Metacomet, and the emergencies and first aid required during the school day, it is impossible to operate as a clinic for problems such as cuts and/or sprained limbs which occur at home. Please respect the expanded roles and responsibilities of the school nurse
- f. Parents are required to take their children's temperature and if student has a fever (100 degrees or more without medication) must stay home. Students who feel sick (stomach ache, fever, cough, sneezing... must stay home)
 - Please do not give students medicine to reduce the fever and send them to school

11. Procedure for Wet/Soiled Clothing

- To provide minimal disruption in a student's school day, the following procedures will be followed to assist students should their clothes become wet and/or soiled:
 - Parents of all students in Grade 3 through Grade 4 must provide an extra set of seasonally appropriate clothing (shirt, pants/skirt, underwear and socks). Please place the extra clothing in a plastic bag that has a zip lock. The clothing will be kept in your child's classroom cubby. If used, they must be replaced the next day
 - o In the event of a spill or an accident, your child will be provided with their extra clean clothes and the necessary items to clean up in the restroom
 - Soiled clothing will be bagged and sent home in your child's backpack
 - School staff may assist the student with zippers, buttons or belts
 - o If a student in unable to properly clean themselves after an accident, of if extra clothes are not available, the parent/guardian will be called by the school
 - In the event a student does not have an extra change of clothes, the school may provide the student with new underwear and clean, used clothing if available

12. Student Participation in School Activities (Recess and Gym)

a. All students are expected to participate in regular activities such as gym and recess. A doctor's note is required to exempt a child from such activities.

13. Foods for Snack and Parties

- a. Please make sure your child brings a healthy snack each day to school.
- b. Students may drink water in the classroom. Juice boxes will be allowed only in the cafeteria during lunch time
- c. Students may not bring in soda, restaurant beverages (Coollatas, tea), juice in cups, candy, gum, or glass containers into school
- d. We will not allow any outside food to be brought in for parties- due to allergies
- e. Please no balloons or special presents for students to unwrap during our school hours

f. All classes are labeled "peanut free". This means that students are not allowed to eat foods that contain nuts in the classroom. Students may eat food that contain nuts in our cafeteria for lunch

14. Cafeteria and Food Services

- a. PAYMENTS
- b. Elementary meal prices are as follows:

Breakfast: \$1.75, \$0.30 Reduced
 Lunch: \$3.00, \$0.40 Reduced

• Milk: .60¢

- c. A student may purchase meals in one of the following ways:
 - by paying cash daily
 - by depositing prepayments (cash, check, or online with a credit/debit card) for meal and a la carte purchases
 - by qualifying for free meals



15. Meal Payment Methods

- a. Each student will have his or her own cafeteria account. Families of paid students may pay in several ways. Account money can be used for food service purchases only. Student meals can be paid by cash daily for each meal or in advance with a larger deposit to cover meals for a period of time. Similarly, meals can also be paid for by a check made payable to "Bloomfield School Food Service". Please include the student identification number on any checks. Student identification numbers are provided by the school. Change is not given for any checks tendered. There is a \$20.00 insufficient fund fee in addition to any bank fees for bounced checks. Cash or checks should be sent to the cafeteria charge person at each school
- b. Families of free and reduced-price students are also reminded that it is very important to complete meal applications *prior* to the start of school when possible. A new application must be completed each year and applications are accepted all year. Please complete forms accurately and legibly. Applications for the 2023 2024 school year will be available on the website during the summer and at each school prior to September
- c. Meal status eligibility is carried over from the previous year until Thursday, October 12th. Meal status will be changed to PAID at this time if no new application is sent or if it is sent late (time must be allowed for processing). In order to avoid this potential charge, applications should be submitted ten business days prior to this expiration date
- d. Families of free and reduced-price students are responsible for all meal charges until meal applications are approved and the status of children is determined. This process may take up to two weeks. Any meal charges incurred prior to eligibility determination must be paid by the family as status cannot be made retroactive
- e. Families of students who are approved via Direct Certification from the State of Connecticut will be notified of the free meal status eligibility by the Food Service Department. Applications do not need to be completed for this
- f. Each lunch period is 30 minutes. Students sit at assigned tables, by class. So that lunch time is pleasurable, students are expected to be courteous to each other following our school rules

16. Recess

- a. Recess is part of the school day and each child is expected to go outside, weather permitting.
- If a medical condition prevents a child from playing outside, you must send in a doctor's note informing us of the situation
- c. Make sure your child has a jacket, hat, and mittens on those cold days
- d. Recess will be held indoors on rainy and/or very cold days (below 20 degrees)
- e. Metacomet School is not responsible for lost, broken or stolen electronics, toys or games

18. Library

- a. Students will have library for 45 minutes once a week
- b. Students are encouraged to select books for independent reading. Please make sure they return the books the following week

19. Toys, Cell Phones, Electronics, Cards, Fidgets

- a. In order for students to concentrate on their school work, we ask that all cell phones, electronic watches, toys, electronic equipment, and trading cards be kept at home. Many times problems happen because a toy gets lost, stolen or broken. Please make sure your child does not bring in these items. All classrooms have phones. There is no reason for your child to have a cell phone or a watch that can call home
- b. Toys, Electronics, Cell Phones, e-watches, Fidget Spinners and Trading Cards will be taken away from the student and returned only when a parent comes to pick the item up
- c. The school and all employees are not responsible for the loss or damage to any student's phone or electronic device/game whether that device is in the student's possession or confiscated by the staff. It is the responsibility of the student to adhere to this policy and to secure his or her belongings at all times

20. Report Cards and Parent-Teacher Conferences

- a. There are two Report Card Conferences per year
 - December 2023 (December 6, 7 and 8)
 - March 2024 (March 6, 7 and 8)
 - Reports are given to parents at conferences. The last report card (June 2024) will be sent home with the students during the last week of school.
- In December and March parents are required to attend a conference to discuss their child's progress
- c. Parents and/or teachers should feel free to request another conference if there is a concern
- d. We require a 24 hour notice before meeting with teachers or visiting a classroom
- e. Due to safety concerns, we will not allow visitors/parents into our school to visit classrooms or walk in our hallways

21. Lost and Found

- a. Please label all articles: clothing, boots, sneakers, lunch boxes, eyeglasses...
- Lost articles are turned into the office or the LOST and FOUND. Please call our school to retrieve lost items

22. Parking on School Grounds

- a. Parents must park in our parking lot. If you are picking up or dropping off students, please park first. The circle area is to be used for busses only between the morning hours of 8:25 am and 9:30am and the afternoon hours of 3:00 pm and 4:30pm
- b. The Bloomfield Police Department will ticket cars parked in the circle
- c. Please park in a parking space-NOT on the side of the building
- d. Please walk children to front door and make sure they enter the school!
- e. NEVER allow children to run in the parking lot

25. Homework

a. We ask that you set a time and place for your child to do their homework each day. The approximate times for homework completion are as follows:

Grade 3- Grade 4- 60 minutes 60 minutes

- b. In addition, every child should read for about 30 minutes daily. We provide books to all students in their homework folder. Parents are also encouraged to read to their children at all grade levels.
- c. Please have your child do the homework (we need to see if our students understand and retain what they have been taught)
- d. After a student has not handed in his/her homework TWICE in one week (Monday-Friday), the teacher is required to send a note home in the agenda book to alert the parent/guardian.
- e. If your child is struggling with the homework, have them stop (after the designated time listed above) and write a note to your child's teacher
- f. If you are experiencing problems (fights, temper tantrums, refusal of your child to do the work), contact your child's teacher so we can help
- g. If your child had a busy night and the homework was not completed, please write a note to the teacher in the agenda book so that we are aware and your child does not have a consequence
