OPEN COURT- READING STRATEGIES

Strategies are plans that our students use to make sense of text. Readers use strategies consciously to achieve the goal of making sense of what they read and remembering key ideas. Students need to learn how to use these strategies independently so that they can recognize and solve problems and are able to dive deeper into the text to make connections and inferences. One of the strategies that our students use is:

<u>Asking Questions-</u> about what they are reading to monitor comprehension.

- Why is the author writing this?
- What did the character do that for?

How is this related to something I may have done?
